#### **Amendment Text**

#### What does the Amendment require?

- For a period of 20 years, the Land Acquisition Trust Fund (LATF) is to receive no less than 33% of net revenues derived from the existing excise tax on documents.
- Funds in the LATF may be expended only to:
  - Finance or refinance a laundry list of approved activities; and
  - Pay the debt service on bonds issued pursuant to the Constitution, which includes P2000 and Florida Forever bonds.
- Moneys in the LATF shall not be commingled with the General Revenue Fund.

#### **Amendment Text**

#### What does the Amendment allow to be funded?

The acquisition and improvement of land, water areas and related property interests,

Including conservation easements, and resources for conservation lands including wetlands, forests, and fish and wildlife habitat;

- Wildlife management areas;
- Lands that protect water resources and drinking water resources,
  Including lands protecting the water quality and quantity of rivers, lakes, streams, springsheds, and lands providing recharge for groundwater and aquifer systems;
- Lands in the Everglades Agricultural Area and Everglades Protection Area;
- Beaches and Shores;
- Outdoor recreation lands, Including recreational trails, parks, and urban open space;
- Rural landscapes;
- Working farms and ranches;
- Historic or geologic sites; and
- Management, restoration of natural systems, and the enhancement of public access or recreational enjoyment of conservation lands.

# Legislative Process/Implementation

- House and Senate Hearings
  - Public Testimony
  - Senate solicits public comment via webpage
- Regular Session
  - Rocky Conclusion
  - No Budget, No Implementing Legislation
- Special Session
  - Implementing legislation passes this creates a framework for Amendment 1
  - Budget passes program funding will be determined each year in the budget (no committed funding amounts or percentages)

## Where did the money go?

### Notable Appropriations

- Debt Service \$190M
- Program related recurring staffing and agency operating expenses -\$172M
- Everglades restoration \$59M
- Land acquisition for springs restoration \$38M
- Land Management \$32.8M
- Beach Projects \$25M
- Land Acquisition for Kissimmee River restoration \$20M
- State Park Facility Improvements \$20M
- Florida Forever \$15M
- Rural land protection easement and land conservation agreements -\$15M
- Restoration of lakes \$10M
- Lake Okeechobee restoration \$5M

# What was/wasn't accomplished

- Accomplished: Inclusion of beaches in Amendment 1 at outset
- Not (yet) accomplished: significant increase in beach funding
  - Overriding factors included:
    - LIP/Medicaid
    - Lack of bonding
    - Both of which made GR scarce.
  - Projected increase of Amendment 1 funds over time should eventually change the dynamic

## **Beach Project Funding Summary**

- \$36.2M total funding for beach management
  - \$29.1M Amendment 1 (LATF) funding
    - \$25M LATF beach projects
    - \$4.1M LATF DEP salaries, benefits, other expenses, etc.
  - \$7.1M GR beach projects
  - \$32.1M in total for beach projects
- 21 projects funded in total
  - 3.5 projects funded from GR
  - 17.5 projects funded from LATF
    - Note one project is partially funded by GR and partially by LATF
- Projects listed in front of budget for first time, rather than described narratively in proviso
- A few projects funded at amounts less than requested

## Where do we go from here?

#### Litigation

- Florida Wildlife Federation, St. Johns Riverkeeper, Environmental Confederation of South Florida, and Manley Fuller
- Complaint alleges that the Legislature misappropriated over \$300 of Amendment 1 funds in violation of the Constitutional mandate to fund "the acquisition, improvement, and maintenance of conservation and recreation lands."
- Complaint lists the appropriations that the Plaintiffs consider appropriate. This list includes the \$25M allocation for beach projects.
- LATF appropriations not listed in the complaint are alleged to fall outside the permissible uses of the Trust Fund.
- Most significant appropriation not listed is salaries for DEP employees \$172M

## Next Steps for FSBPA

- Legislative Process/Continued Implementation
  - Budget
  - As Amendment 1 allocation increases, funding for beaches must be increased as well
- Revisit Criteria for ranking beach projects
  - Integrity of the annual project selection process must be re-established to ensure continuation of a statewide program rather than a member project process
