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Sixth Canaveral Harbor Sand Bypass Event Underway

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Jacksonville District, awarded a \$40.6 million contract on September 20, 2024, to Great Lakes Dredge & Dock, LLC., of Houston, Texas, for the sixth iteration of the Canaveral Harbor Sand Bypass project.

USACE is providing 100% of the total funding to dredge and bypass approximately 1.5 million cubic yards of sand from the shoreline immediately north of Port Canaveral for placement along two segments of critically eroded shoreline in Brevard County, Florida. The first segment runs along approximately 3.3 miles of shoreline starting just south of Jetty Park in the City of Cape Canaveral to about Shepard Park in the City of Cocoa Beach. The second segment runs along approximately 3.7 miles of shoreline from just south of Lori Wilson Park in Cocoa Beach to the northern border of Patrick Space Force Base.

The placement of sand on the beach is expected to begin in mid-January and be completed by mid-April 2025 to ensure all equipment is off the beach before the start of the sea turtle nesting season. Approximately 57,000 feet of pipeline is being used to transport sand from the dredge area to the beach fill segments with the majority of the pipeline being placed offshore.


The Canaveral Harbor Sand Bypass project is a federally authorized project designed to mitigate for downdrift erosion damages caused by the Canaveral Harbor Federal navigation project. Previous bypassing efforts were completed in 1995, 1998, 2007, 2010, and 2019, which pumped a combined total of over 4.7 million cubic yards of sand onto Brevard County beaches.

The USACE-led project is being executed in partnership with the non-Federal sponsor, Canaveral Port Authority, Brevard County Natural Resources Management Department, their costal engineering consultant Foth/Olsen, and U.S. Space Force Space Launch Delta 45 to ensure the project is delivered efficiently, safely, and on schedule.
